Mr. Collins read the following Ordinance noting that copies were available for the public:

An Ordinance Of The Borough Of Monmouth Beach, County Of Monmouth, State Of New Jersey Amending Chapter XI Entitled "Beaches, Dunes, Pavilion And Waterways" Section 11-2.2 Entitled "Facility Fees, Beach Rates And Bathhouse Charges

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Commissioner McBride that the public hearing be opened.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -3 Nay -0.

The Mayor asked the audience if anyone would like to speak on this ordinance. She advised that this amendment provides for free beach badges to certain persons in recognition of their volunteer service in the community. No person requested to speak.

Commissioner McBride moved, seconded by Commissioner Cunniff that the public hearing be closed.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -3 Nay -0.

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Commissioner McBride that the ordinance be adopted on second reading and public hearing.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -3 Nay-0.

Mr. Collins advised that the next item on the agenda was the Public Hearing on the 2012 Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Grant Application.

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Commissioner McBride that the public hearing be opened.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -3 Nay-0.

Robert Stetz, Monmouth Beach Borough Engineer, presented to the public attendees details regarding the potential application submittal to the Monmouth County Open Space Program for funding for Griffin Park Improvements. He reviewed with the attendees the program requirements and the public hearing, public hearing notice, and resolution requirements. Mr. Stetz informed the attendees that the town has been awarded previously by the Monmouth County Open Space Program for improvements made to the restroom and playground facilities at Griffin Park. Mr. Stetz recapped the initial Borough Meeting for this project, which took place on July 16, 2012, and reviewed the scope of the project and estimated cost. Mr. Stetz then discussed the project need and recapped the second meeting on the project during which he met with the Recreation Commission. Mr. Stetz informed the attendees that the proposed project scope incorporates the reorientation of the soccer field in addition to grading the field so water will drain off the field better. In addition, the Borough wished to install artificial turf on the Little League baseball field, install two (2) new basketball courts, an artificial turf infield on the softball field, clean out, weed, and rehabilitate the playground area, repair the existing gazebo, upgrade the walkway and safety lighting, and install fitness stations around the park. Mr. Stetz declared that the estimated cost of the project is \$621,000 and the Borough is asking for \$250,000 in funding from the Monmouth County Open Space Program.

Matthew Walter, Chairperson of the Recreation Commission addressed the audience and spoke about past work that had been done on the Little League field, but was not sufficient to fix the recurring issues inhibiting play on the field. Mr. Walter also declared that the original facility dates back to 1954 and that all members of the Recreation Commission have been apprised of the proposed project at Griffin Park.

Commissioner McBride stated He and Mr. Walter had met multiple times over the last six (6) months to discuss the project.

Mr. Stetz stated other discussions on the proposed project scope had included the possibility of installing lights on the ball fields and paddle tennis courts. The possibility of increased noise and impact on the neighborhood deterred the installation of lights.

Commissioner Cunniff inquired as to whether two (2) basketball courts were needed.

Tim Riepl, of 20 Ocean Avenue, runs the recreation basketball program and stated that on Saturday evenings, twenty-six (26) young athletes in grades five (5) and six (6) will be using the facilities at Griffin Park.

Dan Thormann, of 21 Riverdale Avenue, stated he believes providing outdoor courts will bring kids to the park instead of other areas of the town.

Kathlane Pavlick, of 6 Johnson Street, spoke of the tennis courts located at Griffin Park. Ms. Pavlick stated the courts are in great condition and have been filled all summer. Ms. Pavlick then stated she believes if the town directed the same attention to the other facilities in the park as it has the tennis courts, more people would use the park.

Commissioner Cunniff stated he is not opposed to a second court but just wanted to establish the need for it.

Matthew Cooke inquired as to the cost the basketball court.

Mr. Stetz replied that the cost is \$120,000 for both basketball courts.

Commissioner Cunniff asked what the cost is for the artificial turf infield.

Mr. Walter replied he thought it would work best for the infield because of the result of geese on the field. Mr. Walter stated the fields are a disaster and they flow directly into the streams.

Commissioner Cunniff asked what would happen when the fields are under water.

Mr. Stetz replied that the artificial turf infield would be nailed down and he would look into how being flooded would affect the turf.

Commissioner McBride stated they would look into the cost of alternatives and how flooding affects the turf.

Mr. Cooke asked what would happen to the rubber pelts as a result of flooding.

Mr. Stetz replied that nothing would happen because the pelts help the water drain better and are environmentally safe.

Commissioner McBride inquired as to the difference between artificial and real turf.

Mr. Stetz replied they will need proper drainage and he will need to look into that issue.

Commissioner Cunniff asked if the artificial turf would be prone to weeds.

Mr. Stetz replied that unless the field is not maintained, the turf will not have weeds. Mr. Stetz stated the turf would need to be power washed and the reason artificial turf is chosen is because it does not require much maintenance.

Commissioner McBride asked the Recreation Commission to speak about the existing configuration of the park.

Mr. Walter stated the soccer field runs east to west and is about Olympic size, but definitely high school size. Mr. Walter stated other towns have complained about the safety issues with the field, which the Recreation Commission has tried to correct without success. The soccer field will be used by micro soccer and older players as well. Mr. Walter stated they have a need for a diverse array of fields and multi-purpose fields because of those sports offered including baseball, Little League, softball, and soccer.

There being no further comments:

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Commissioner McBride that the public hearing be closed.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -3 Nav-0.

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Commissioner McBride that the following Resolution be adopted:

#### MUNICIPAL RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders has approved an Open Space Trust Fund and established a Municipal Open Space Program to provide Program Grant funds in connection with municipal acquisition of lands for County Park, recreation, conservation and farmland preservation purposes, as well as for County recreation and conservation development and maintenance purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of the Borough of Monmouth Beach desires to obtain County Open Space Trust Funds in the amount of \$250,000.00 to fund Griffin Park Improvements, Griffin Street between Margaret Avenue and Tocci Avenue (Block 43.01, Lot 1 and Block 44, Lot 37); and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the project including all matching funds is \$620,755.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Monmouth Beach is the owner of and controls the project site.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MONMOUTH BEACH THAT:

- 1. Francis W. Mullan, Borough Engineer for the Borough of Monmouth Beach, is authorized to (a) make an application to the County of Monmouth for Open Space Trust Funds, (b) provide additional application information and furnish such documents as may be required for the Municipal Open Space Grants Program and (c) act as the municipal contact person and correspondent of the above named municipality; and
- 2. The Borough of Monmouth Beach is committed to this project and will provide the balance of funding necessary to complete the project in the form of non-county matching funds as required in the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Program; and
- 3. If the County of Monmouth determines that the application is complete and in conformance with the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Program and the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Municipal Grants Program adopted thereto, the municipality is willing to use the approved Open Space Trust Funds in accordance with such policies and procedures, and applicable federal, state, and local government rules, regulations and statutes thereto; and
- 4. Susan Howard, Mayor of the Borough of Monmouth Beach, is hereby authorized to sign and execute any required documents, agreements, and amendments thereto with the County of Monmouth for the approved Open Space Trust Funds; and
- 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

#### Administrator's Report:

Mr. Chismar advised that he had no report.
