- Section 3. That any Authorized Municipal Representative is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all documents and instruments and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for carrying out the sale, issuance and delivery of the Bonds, the Authority's Capital Equipment Pooled Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2013 and all related transactions contemplated by this resolution.
- Section 4. All resolutions or proceedings, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.
- Section 5. This resolution shall become effective immediately.

Commissioner McBride moved, seconded by Commissioner Cunniff that the meeting be opened to the public.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -3-.

JoAnn Samon came forward to address the Board of Commissioners. She explained that she was co-guardian, along with her brother, of their sister Rosemary, who was profoundly handicapped and who was a resident of the Woodbridge Developmental Center. Ms. Samon said that her sister was 58 years old and has been living at the center since she was 20. She said that the State was trying to move the residents of the center, who were all profoundly impaired, into group homes. She explained that these residents needed the care of doctors, nurses and the other trained staff of the center and would not be able to function outside of that atmosphere. Ms. Samon said the residents of the development centers had no voice and it was crucial to keep these centers open. She distributed information on the centers to the Commissioners. Ms. Samon asked the Commissioners to pass a Resolution requesting that the Governor keep the centers open.

Mayor Howard said that a special meeting of the Board of Commissioners was scheduled for July 23rd and she asked Dennis Collins to prepare a Resolution opposing the closing of the State's Developmental Centers that they could pass at that meeting.

There being no further business and no comments or questions from the audience,

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Commissioner McBride that the meeting be closed.
