Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Mayor Howard that the following Consent Agenda items be passed and adopted:

### RESOLUTION

Whereas, 36 children in the United States will be diagnosed with cancer each day and at an average age of six-years-old; and,

Whereas, one out of five children diagnosed with cancer will not survive the disease; and,

Whereas, the types of cancers that affect children are most often very different from those that affect adults; and,

Whereas, childhood cancer is not just one disease but is made up of a dozen types and countless subtypes of cancer; and,

Whereas, childhood cancer spares no socioeconomic, ethnic, racial or geographic class; and,

Whereas, pediatric cancer is the leading cause of death by disease in US children under 15 years of age; and,

Whereas, the causes of most pediatric cancers are largely unknown and not strongly linked to lifestyle, unlike adult cancers; and,

Whereas, two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will develop long-lasting chronic conditions resulting from treatment; and,

Whereas, the childhood cancer rates have been rising for the past few decades, and approximately 11,630 children in the US under the age of 15 will be diagnosed with cancer in 2013; and,

Whereas, cancer kills more kids than AIDS, asthma, cystic fibrosis, diabetes, and muscular dystrophy combined; and,

Whereas, in the last 25 years, only 2 drugs have been specifically developed for children's cancer; and,

Whereas, less than 5% of the federal government's total funding for cancer research is dedicated to childhood cancers, and only about 3% of funds raised for the National Cancer Institute go directly to pediatric cancer research; and,

Whereas, the funding for pediatric cancer research has gone down steadily since 2003; and,

Whereas, despite the facts, childhood cancer research is vastly and consistently underfunded; and,

Whereas, despite major advances in treatment, it is still critically important to conduct research and increase awareness regarding pediatric cancer,

Therefore, I, Susan Howard, Mayor of the Borough of Monmouth Beach, do hereby proclaim September 2013 CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in Monmouth Beach in order to help raise awareness of pediatric cancer and its victims.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS BY THE BOROUGH OF MONMOUTH BEACH, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$2,160,000 THEREFOR, INCLUDING A GRANT IN THE AMOUT OF \$225,000 EXPECTED TO BE RECEIVED FROM THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,841,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

The Clerk stated that copies of the Ordinance were available to the public.

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Mayor Howard that the hearing on the Ordinance be opened to the public.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -2-, Absent -1-.

Mayor Howard said the Bond Ordinance would provide funding for the items listed in the Ordinance as items a through r. Mayor Howard read each of the items, and when she finished, she asked if anyone from the audience had any comments or questions on the Ordinance.

There being no comments or questions from the audience,

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Mayor Howard, that the hearing on the Ordinance be closed.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -2-, Absent -1-.

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Mayor Howard, that the Ordinance be passed and adopted after a second reading and a public hearing.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -2-, Absent -1-.

Administrator's Report: Mayor Howard said that Mr. Chismar was away on vacation in Italy.

Attorney's Report: Mr. Collins had nothing to report.

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Mayor Howard that the meeting be opened to the public.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -2-, Absent -1-.

Roberta Jones, 4 Cook Street, asked if residents were allowed to place a shed and other items on Borough owned property.

Chief Winans said the Borough property in question was a parcel that ran between Cook Street and Jessica Place. He said he was familiar with the property and homeowner in question and that he had already spoken with Bonnie Heard, the Zoning Officer, about it. Chief Winans said that Ms. Heard had sent a letter to the homeowner instructing them to remove the items from the Borough property or to appeal to the Board of Commissioners to allow them to use it.

Ms. Jones said she had been told that that it was a Borough easement and that the Borough had refused to sell it. She said she had been told that it was a safety issue as the Borough needed to have that piece of land in order to be able to get their emergency vehicles into the area.

Mayor Howard said that the Commissioners always did their due diligence whenever they were approached and asked to sell a Borough owned piece of property.

Ms. Jones asked how a resident would know if the Borough was selling a piece of property.

Dennis Collins explained that an Ordinance would have to be done and all adjacent property owners would be notified. He said there were publication requirements for any Ordinance considered by the Commissioners.

Bonnie Crotty, 10 Cook Street, said that a homeowner in the area appeared to have two sheds and two garages on their lot and she felt that the property was becoming an eyesore.

Mayor Howard asked Chief Winans to have Bonnie Heard check it out.

Chief Winans said he would also look at the area.

At this time Mr. Collins said the Commissioners would go into executive session. He said that no official action would be taken and that the Commissioners would re-convene the regular meeting at the conclusion of the closed session.

Commissioner Cunniff offered the following Resolution which was seconded by Mayor Howard:

## RESOLUTION

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the following portion of this meeting dealing with the following generally described matters shall not be open to the public: contract negotiations and matters related to pending/anticipated litigation or contract negotiations in which the public body is or may be a party; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that it is anticipated that the matters to be considered in private may be disclosed to the public at a later date when confidentiality is no longer required:

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that private consideration is deemed required and is permitted because of the following noted exceptions set forth in the Open Public Meetings Act:

Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is or may become a party.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -2-, Absent -1-.

At the conclusion of the executive session,

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Mayor Howard that the executive session be adjourned and that the regular meeting be re-convened.

Upon the call of the roll the foregoing motion was carried by the following vote: Aye -2-, Absent -1-.

Commissioner Cunniff moved, seconded by Mayor Howard that the meeting be closed.
